## **Recommended Cuts to Restore in FY 2011 Budget**

## **HOUSING**

**Local Rent Supplement** 

Restore funds cut from the FY 2010 budget. \$2 million

**Home Purchase Assistance Program** 

Restore funds cut in the FY 2011 budget and use funds to increase the loan amount. \$3 million

**Emergency Rental Assistance** 

Funding in 2011 – \$7.4 million – is \$1.3 below approved

FY2010 level. If anything, ERAP should be expanded. \$1.3 million or more

**Energy Assistance** 

Local funding for benefits in FY 2011 is \$4 million below the FY 2008 level. \$4 million

ADULT EDUCATION AND TRAINING

**Adult Job Training** 

The budget would entirely eliminate funds provided in FY 2010. \$4.6 million

Adult Education \$2.3 million

The budget would cut funding for adult education providers and scholarships for low-income students.

MAKE WORK PAY

Restore FY 2011 Child Care Cut: Funding has fallen \$27 million since 2007. \$4 million

**Earned Income Tax Credit** 

The budget would scale back this tax benefit for the working poor. \$1 million

**HEALTH AND DISABILITY ASSISTANCE** 

**Interim Disability Assistance** 

Participation is capped at 1,500 – about half of last year's level. \$7 million

**Healthcare Provider Reimbursements** 

Low reimbursements make it hard for residents to access services,

at a time when more health services are being privatized. \$8 million

**MAINTAIN FAMILY STABILITY** 

**Grandparent Caregiver** 

Helps grandparents caring for grandchildren and keeps children out of foster care. \$2 million

**Rapid Housing** 

The budget would eliminate this program, which keeps families

together and keeps children out of foster care. \$1.1 million

**Access to Justice** 

Provides critical legal services to low-income families, such as those facing eviction. \$1.1 million
