The policy analyst will conduct research and engage in advocacy to influence DC budget and other policies.

DCFPI influences DC budget and policy decisions through research and analysis, direct engagement with policymakers, and strategic partnerships with other organizations. DCFPI is a key research resource on DC income, poverty, and employment and wage trends.

Duties

- Conduct quantitative and qualitative research, and prepare policy reports and briefs
- Lead DCFPI's work in health care policy and possibly other issue areas
- Analyze pending legislative or DC budget proposals
- Represent DCFPI in advocacy coalitions
- Make public presentations of DCFPI research

Qualifications

Applicants should have an interest in fiscal policy issues and poverty issues, and have the following skills/experience:

- Graduate degree in public policy or related field, or relevant experience
- Facility with spreadsheets and statistical database programs such as STATA
- Work experience in a public policy setting, preferably including advocacy experience
- Excellent writing skills
- Ability to work on multiple tasks in a time-sensitive manner
- Knowledge of health policy, particularly Medicaid, is preferred
