

#### DC's Tax Collections Have Recovered from the Recession, But Only Just Above 2008 Levels\*




\*Figures are adjusted for inflation to equal FY 2014 dollars and do not include non-tax revenues

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
While DC's Finances May Have Recovered, But Many Groups of Residents are Being Left Behind

Child Poverty has Increased by One-Third Since 2007




#### Nearly One in Four Single Parents Were Unemployed



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#### Funding for Human Services & Other Low-Income Programs Grew Slowly from FY 12-FY13




Other low-income programs include the following agencies removed from Economic Development: Employment Services, Housing and Community Development, Housing Authority and Housing Production Trust Fund

Several Programs Aimed at Helping DC's Most Vulnerable Residents are Strapped

- Funding for TANF work programs can serve only 63 percent of time-limited families.
- DC's childcare program has seen its subsidy budget cut by \$30 million over the last five years.
- The number of residents with disabilities getting assistance from the Interim Disability Assistance program has dropped 80 percent since 2009.
- Funding for affordable housing has fallen by 27 percent since 2008.

#### Even with Revenue Growth Mayor and Council will Have Limited Funds in FY 2014

- Additional revenue in FY 2014 is \$178 million
- Current Services
  Funding gap is \$107
  million
- Funding already committed for 2 percent per pupil funding increase
  - Enrollment has grown at in DC's Public & Charter Schools



## How Should Mayor & Council Approach FY 2014 Budget?

- Ensure Residents Have Access to Health Care:
  - Maintain Healthcare Alliance
  - Increase reimbursement rates for mental health providers
- Help DC Residents Cope with Rising Housing Costs
  - \$100 million (!) pledge from Mayor
  - Schedule H
  - Prevention, Production, Preservation, and Housing for most Vulnerable Residents
  - Adequate homeless services budget

- Give Children a Safe Place to Learn and Grow
  - Increase Childcare reimbursement rates
  - Increase funds for out of school time and summer school
- Give Parents the Tools to Succeed in the Job Market
  - Adequate funding for job training slots in TANF
- Help DC Individuals and Families facing Crises
  - Mayor Gray delays TANF benefit cut
  - TANF exemptions
  - Increased funding for IDA
