



Local Funding For Affordable Housing Will Hit A Record In 2016




Housing Production Trust Fund Will Get \$100 Million In 2016

During Annual Count More Than Doubled Between 2011 And 2014.









TANF ENROLLMENT OCTOBER 1996 TO OCTOBER 2015







After a Year of Increased Investments, FY 2016 Budget Flat-Funds School Formula, Leaving Schools To Absorb Costs Of Inflation


GROWTH IN LOCAL FUNDING BY SECTOR in Thousands

DISTRIBUTION OF DCPS' AT-RISK FUNDING IN FY 2015 AND FY 2016 BY WARD in Millions





Share of DCPS Total At-Risk Funding, \$45 Million



LOCAL AND GROSS MEDICAID PAYMENTS in Millions


