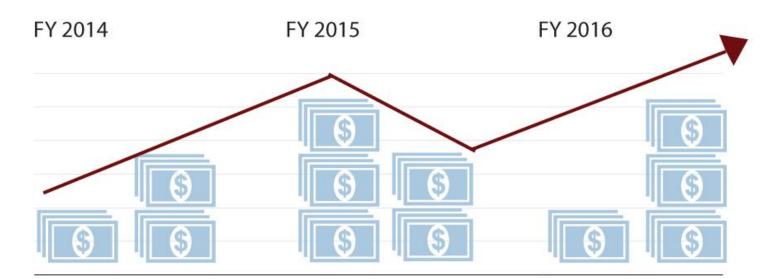

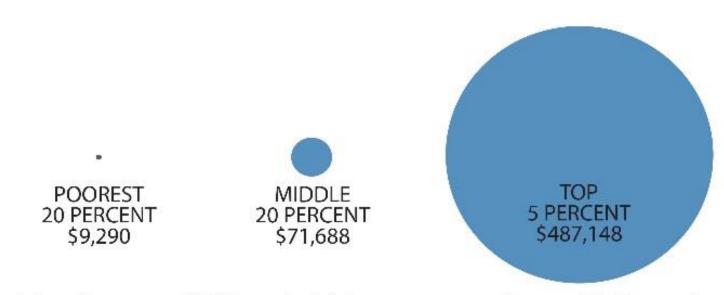

Income Inequality in DC Is Wide



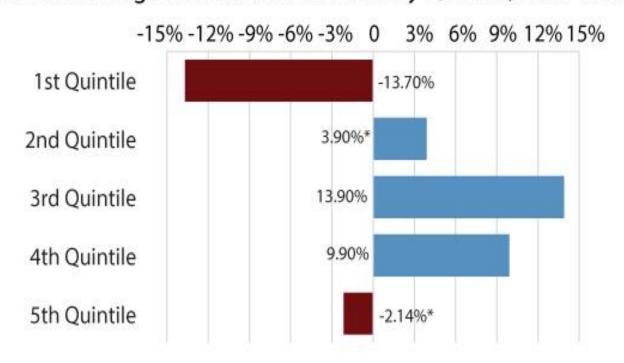
The richest 5 percent of DC households have an average income 52 times as large as the bottom 20 percent of households and nearly 7 times as large as the middle 20 percent of households

Percent Change in Household Income by Quintile, 2007 to 2014



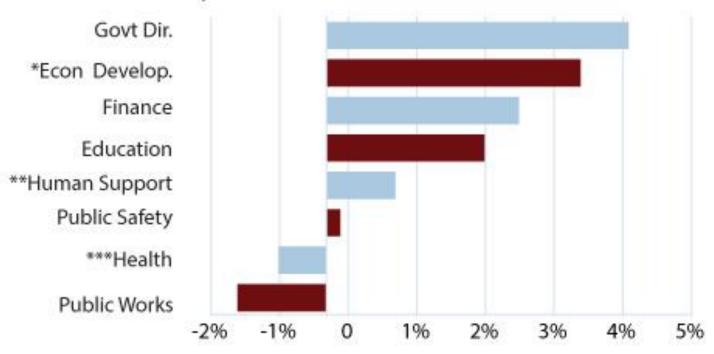

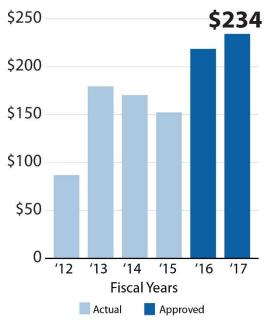

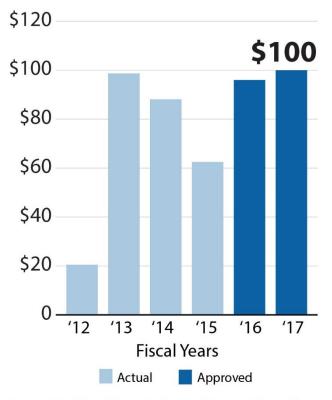

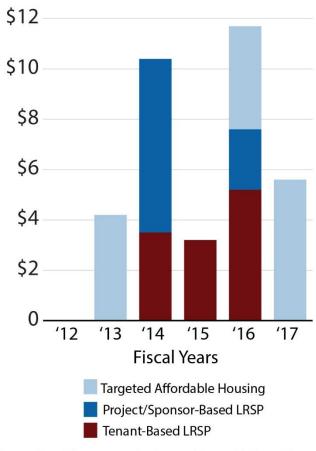

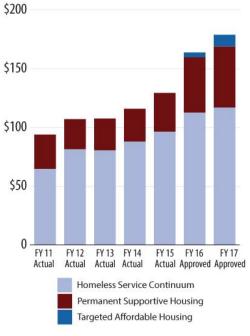

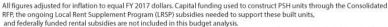


Funding for Homeless Services Will Rise, But Not Enough to Meet the Need

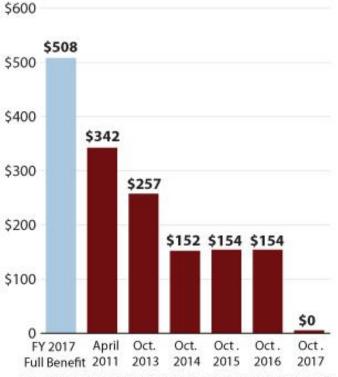

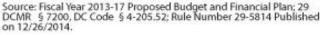

TANF BENEFITS FOR FAMILIES OVER 60 MONTHS Monthly benefits for a family of 3



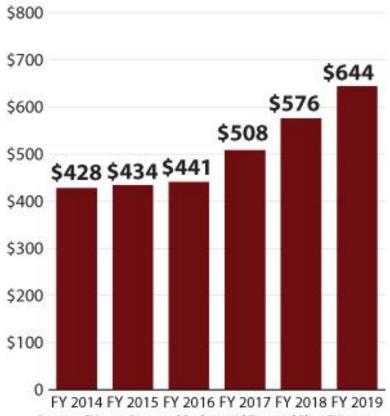




TANF Benefits Will Rise for Families Not Subject to Time Limit

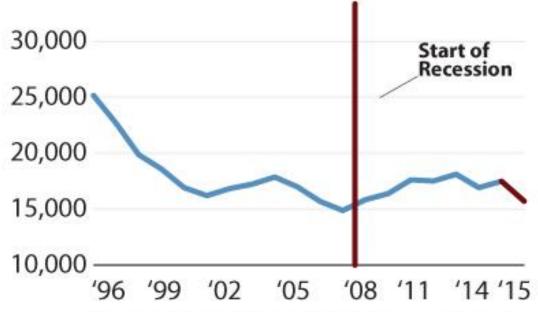

DC Families on TANF Fell in 90s Before Time Limit & Have Stayed Roughly the Same for Over a Decade



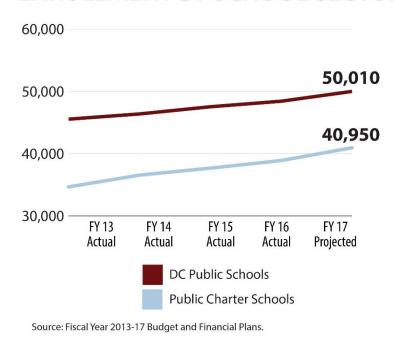

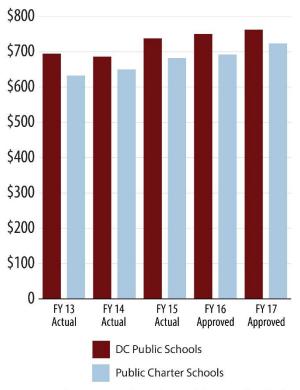
GROWTH IN PROJECTED STUDENT ENROLLMENT BY SCHOOL SECTOR





GROWTH IN LOCAL FUNDING BY SCHOOL SECTOR

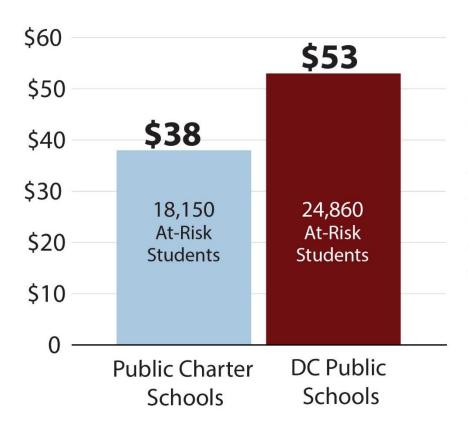

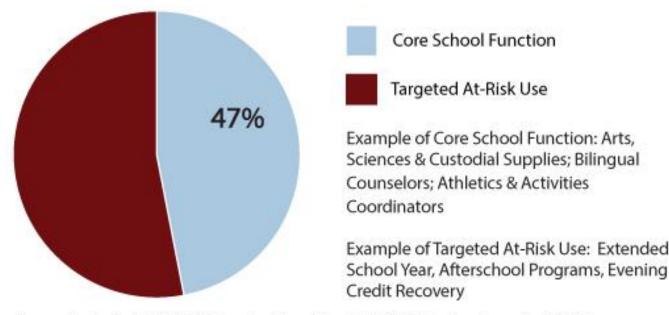

DCPS At-Risk Funds Are Not All Being Used To Supplement Services for Low-Income Students

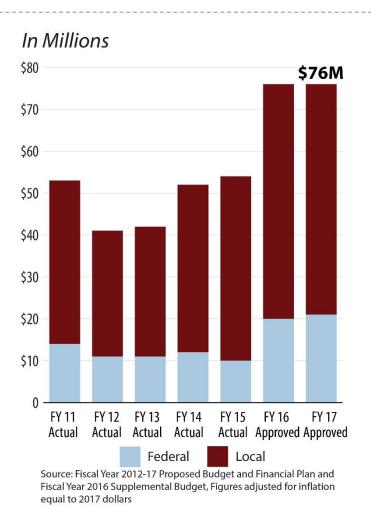
DCPS ALLOCATION OF \$47 MILLION IN "AT-RISK" FUNDS FOR 2016-17 SCHOOL YEAR



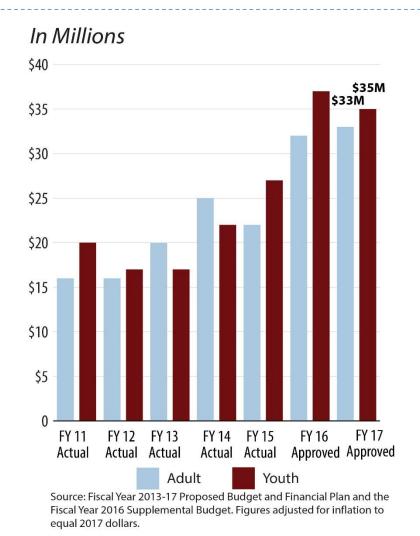

FY 2017 Funding for Workforce Development at the Department of Employment Services Is Flat



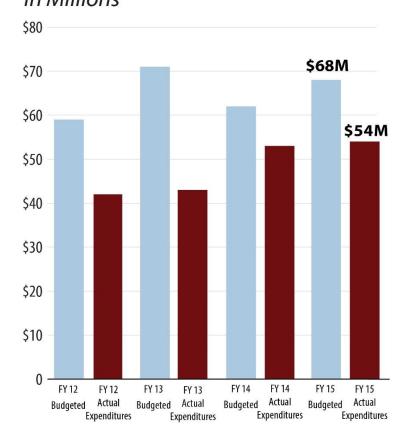
Funding for Youth Employment Is Now Higher Than for Adult Employment

BUDGETED VS. ACTUAL SPENDING ON WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AT DOES In Millions

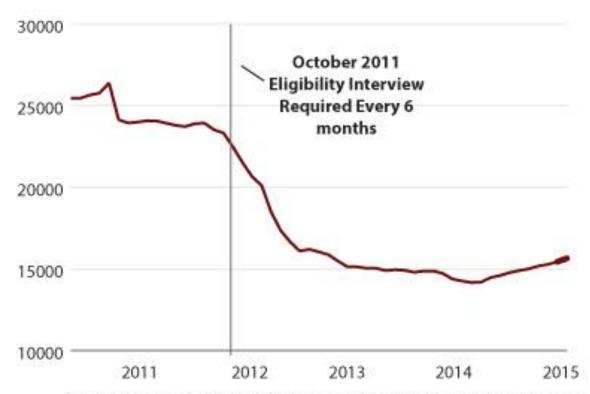

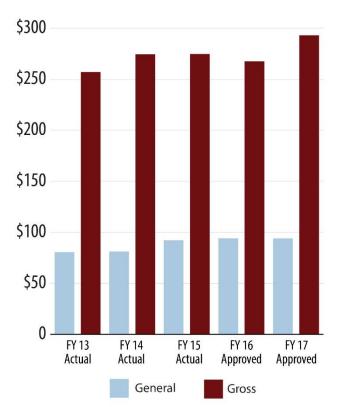

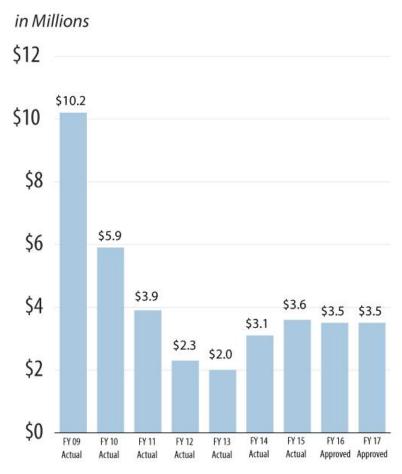
GENERAL AND GROSS FUNDING FOR DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH In Millions

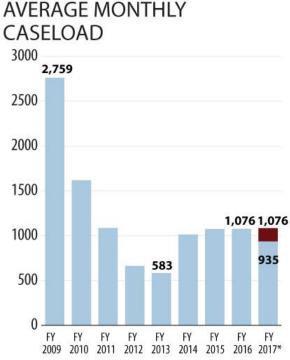
Funding for Interim Disability Assistance Has Been Cut Sharply Since 2009
